CHAPTER 310

GOVERNMENT — STATE

PUBLIC RECORDS - INSPECTION, COPYING, OR PHOTOGRAPHING

SENATE BILL NO. 217. BY SENATORS Zakhem, Hughes, R. Powers, and Schaefer; also REPRESENTATIVES Minahan, Erickson, Larson, Stephenson, Gillis, Hudson, and Prendergast.

AN ACT

ALLOWING SCHOOL BOARDS TO RELEASE DATA ON HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS TO RECRUITING OFFICERS OF THE UNITED STATES ARMED FORCES.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

Section 1. 24-72-204 (3), Colorado Revised Statutes 1973, is amended BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW PARAGRAPH to read:

24-72-204. Allowance or denial of inspection - grounds - procedure - appeal. (3) (d) Notwithstanding the provisions of subparagraph (VI) of paragraph (a) of this subsection (3), under policies adopted by the local board of education, the names and addresses of students in any secondary school may be released to a recruiting officer for any branch of the United States armed forces who requests such information, unless the student requests in writing that said information not be released. The recruiting officer shall use the data released for the purpose of providing information to students regarding military service and shall not use it for any other purpose or release such data to any person or organization other than individuals within the recruiting services of the armed forces.

Section 2. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
