AN ACT

AMENDING 12-22-404 (1)(1), COLORADO REVISED STATUTES 1973, TO CLARIFY THAT THE POSSESSION OR USE OR ATTEMPT TO OBTAIN OR PROCURE THE ADMINISTRATION OF CANNABIS CONCENTRATE IS AN UNLAWFUL ACT.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

Section 1. 12-22-404 (1) (1), Colorado Revised Statutes 1973, 1978 Repl. Vol., is amended to read:

12-22-404. Unlawful acts. (1) (1) The possession or use or attempt to obtain or procure the administration of cannabis OR CANNABIS CONCENTRATE, which shall be punished as provided in section 12-22-412 (12).

Section 2. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
