**AN ACT**

AMENDING 12-22-404 (1)(I), COLORADO REVISED STATUTES 1973, TO CLARIFY THAT THE POSSESSION OR USE OR ATTEMPT TO OBTAIN OR PROCURE THE ADMINISTRATION OF CANNABIS CONCENTRATE IS AN UNLAWFUL ACT.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

Section 1. 12-22-404 (1) (I), Colorado Revised Statutes 1973, 1978 Repl. Vol., is amended to read:

**12-22-404. Unlawful acts.** (1) (I) The possession or use or attempt to obtain or procure the administration of cannabis OR CANNABIS CONCENTRATE, which shall be punished as provided in section 12-22-412 (12).

Section 2. **Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
